Leikness Family Chosen as 2018 MAHFH Partner Family

Persistence might be the theme of the Leikness family. Ashley, who was born in Alaska, lived in the Marshfield area as a child until her family relocated to Florida. She first met Marshfield native Daren when she was visiting cousins for the summer. Years passed between that first meeting and the time that Ashley decided to return to Marshfield in 2011. Shortly after her return, she and Daren reconnected and they were married in 2014. Daren and Ashley have three children: Jaden, 11, who lives with Ashley's mother in Florida, Paityn, 9, and Zander, 4. "It's been quite the journey," chuckles Daren.

Part of that journey involved the family moving from rental to rental, sometimes as often as twice in one year. "We just moved so much," says Ashley, "and we were just sick of it."

Daren gives Ashley credit for being the one who originally applied for a home from Marshfield Area Habitat for Humanity (MAHFH). She was familiar with the organization but, even though they hadn't been able to qualify for a traditional mortgage, hadn't considered that they might qualify. In fact, the Leikness family came very close to being chosen as a partner family around three years ago. But when another family was chosen, Ashley says they were strongly encouraged to reapply.

After taking a break to regroup and recover from the heartbreak of not being chosen with their first application, Daren and Ashley decided to try again three years later. Fortunately for them, MAHFH had a vacant home that had been built in 2015 waiting for a family. Ashley says, "I'd drive by this house every day since it was built, and I'd think 'man, we could just move in there!"

When asked if they'd be willing to move into a previously built home, the Leikness family was quick to agree. They are currently working to complete their required 'Sweat Equity' hours and will soon sign their mortgage and own their home. "I never saw us being able to buy a home," Ashley says. "That dream was pretty far off."

The Leiknesses are thankful that they had a second opportunity to be a partner family and for the helpful and friendly Marshfield Habitat representatives they've been able to work with. Now that the dream is nearly a reality Daren feels, "after this, the sky's the limit."

How You Can Help the Mission of MAHFH

Marshfield Area Habitat for Humanity depends on its many volunteers to help with building or rehabbing a house, serving on its Board of Directors and many committees, for which we are very grateful. At this time, we have four openings on our Board for someone with a background in real estate, mortgage/banking, fundraising and public relations. All of our Board members serve a minimum of 3 years with a maximum of six years. You would also serve as a member or Chair of one of our Operating Committees. Your commitment would be anywhere from 3 hours per month to 2 hours per week as needed.

We are also seeking committee members for the following committees:

Development: Responsible for coordinating the fundraising operations to sustain MAHFH. Tasks include fundraising campaigns and special events, possible grant writing, and building relationships with our donors. They shall emphasize and promote the importance of Christian stewardship in the servicing of donors and supporters.

Public Relations: Responsible for educating and informing the public regarding our mission and purpose, the need for better and more affordable housing in our service area, and the steps being taken to meet this need. The tasks to be coordinated by its members shall include public speaking, communicating with the news media and publishing a semi-annual newsletter.

Family Selection and Support: Responsible for updating our selection criteria and policies, interviewing applicants and recommending applicants to the Board for approval as prospective homeowners. Provides our Habitat homeowners and prospective homeowners with a support system, education opportunities and a forum for discussions pertaining to home ownership and maintenance, all for the purpose of helping families to break the poverty cycle and become independent.

Site Selection: Responsible for targeting the area or areas of our service area in which we will develop our projects, investigating and researching the availability of property and recommending it to the Board for acquisition. Work in conjunction with the Building Committee to evaluate the suitability of potential sites prior to acquisition.

Building Committee: Responsible for planning and implementing the construction projects of the corporation. Tasks include obtaining house plans, soliciting professional help and donations of building materials, coordinating volunteers and supervising construction. (All Board members must help at least one day during a build).

Technology/Marketing: Responsible for developing and updating our website. Marketing for our affiliate by designing or updating brochures, and other materials as needed.

Novy Fund Update

The primary focus of the Novy Fund is to assist Marshfield area individuals/families who need safety items (grab bars, hand rails, ramps) installed, small home repairs and replacement of items needed for living (water heaters, roofs). The program will require repayment of the costs of material (with potential longer term repayment), with labor provided by Marshfield Area Habitat for Humanity volunteers. From July 2017-June 2018, the Novy fund provided:

- Minor door repairs for an elderly woman
- Critical home repair
- Two ramps for two separate homes
- Installation of a portable aluminum ramp
- Purchasing of lumber for home repairs
- Replacement of a temporary ramp with a permanent ramp. Then moved the temporary ramp to a new location.
- Construction of a 28 ft. ramp for an elderly woman at her mobile home.
- Exploration of a request for new shingles for a veteran located in the county and found other options for this request.

Ways to Give
