Vinny gets a New Home!!

Thanks to your generosity, Vinny was able to move into a new house this past winter.

Vinny is ten years old and has a condition called Spina bifida. Spina bifida affects the spine and is usually apparent at birth. It is a type of neural tube defect (NTD). Spina bifida can happen anywhere along the spine if the neural tube does not close all the way. When the neural tube does not close all the way, the backbone that protects the spinal cord does not form and close, as it should. Because of this, Vinny is in a wheel chair. Vinny's old house was not handicap accessible, there were stairs to enter the house, narrow doorways, no bathtub on the main floor and no features that could help Vinny be independent. Whenever Vinny needed to leave the house, for example, going to school, someone had to carry him down a short flight of stairs and on his return home, once inside, Vinny had to be transferred to a chair and wait until his parents brought the wheelchair in from the vehicle.





In his new home, Vinny scoots up the ramp, built by volunteers, on his own. This has set Vinny on a path of independence.

His mother Jackie said, "I am very proud of my son that he can do things on his own."

Vinny is enjoying his new home, his own space, and his new found independence, along with his two sisters, Maya age five, Ava age four and his parents Jackie and James.

Thank you to the volunteers and to those who donate to our local Marshfield Area Habitat for Humanity[®], which makes improving lives, not just a hope, but also a reality in our community.


